Carl Davidson is our Zoning expert on your Board of Directors. He is extremely knowledgeable and has been instrumental in preparing for a number of recent hearings.

I have also been active, attending a public meeting on the AT&T cell phone tower that was recently erected on Wyoming. Your City Councilor has sponsored a text amendment to the zoning code to prevent future occurrences of this – where a short utility pole is "collocated" to allow a 60 ft. cell tower to be added to it. Why should Heritage Hills be involved? As your representative on the District 4 Coalition of Neighborhood Associations, it is my responsibility to ensure that nothing like this happens in our neighborhood, or anywhere else in the city for that matter. This specific zone amendment was before the Environmental Planning Commission in April and a recommendation of approval was forwarded to City Council.

Michael Rowan has been elected to be your Vice President. He succeeds Robert Preissler who has served very successfully in that role for a number of years, but needed more time for his many other commitments. The good news is that he is still on your Board of Directors. Michael brings many business skills to his new role and we feel very fortunate to have him as VP. He set up both Nextdoor and our website and thanks to him and Christy we now have over 80 members on Nextdoor. Kudos to both of them for a great job.

I have reproduced an article by Michael from our January Newsletter on our online activities, since that was only for members and those that we

have e-mail addresses for. I do urge you to consider signing up for Nextdoor as this is proving to be a valuable tool for neighbors to connect whether it be a notification of criminal activity, missing pets, or exchanging contacts of handymen etc.

On the subject of criminal activity we have had 16 total incidents for the first 3 months of 2014 ranging from assaults to graffiti. If you see something suspicious call 242-COPS if it is not an emergency, or 911 if it is a crime in progress. Try to give as much information as you can, but never put yourself in harm's way.



Summer Reading Programs for Children

If you are new to the Albuquerque area, or even if you aren't, you may not know about a couple of great summer programs to keep your kids or grandkids reading while they're out of school.

The first one is for all ages: children, teens and adults. It's hosted by the Albuquerque Bernalillo County Library. It begins at the start of June and runs through the end of July. Exact dates will be posted at http://abclibrary.org/summerreading. You simply stop at a library branch, such as our very own Cherry Hills Library, fill out the registration card and get going on your reading log. Kids (including babies - you can read to them and count that!) get a bag with a bookmark too. Kids up to age 11 can go in each week during the 8-week program and pick up a prize when they show their reading log. There is one section of prizes for babies and one for kids. Sometimes the prizes are new paperback or board books. My children love stopping in to get a prize and then stock up on more library books to read at home. Teens and adults keep track of their reading and turn in completed reading cards at any time. Weekly drawings for those ages are held at each branch.

There are also several special events held on various days at each library branch like fun musical performances, puppet shows, and guest storytellers. For teens, there are arts and sciences workshops. You'll get a schedule of these events when you register for the reading program. Be sure to go early in June so you don't miss out on anything!

The other reading program, which is only for preschool through 5th grade, is sponsored by a local restaurant, Dion's. You can pick up a Club Read card for your child at Dion's or print one at home from http://www.dions.com. After reading 6 books, your child can go back to Dion's and get a few prizes, plus another "scorecard." The backpack prize isn't like a backpack you would take to school - it's more of a book bag or knapsack. If you want to keep going with the program, you read more books and take your second card to the office at Isotopes Park to get even more prizes and be entered into a drawing for grand prizes like baseball game tickets and free pizza. This program began in March but it runs until July 25 and it doesn't matter when you start your first card.

Have fun reading this summer!
