A recent posting on CrimeMapping showed a large number of vehicle burglaries occurring around the time most people are leaving for work – as fall approaches with colder temperatures, there is a great temptation to warm the car up while getting a cup of coffee to go. You are inviting anyone passing to take your registration etc. out of the glove compartment – now you have identity theft to spend time and effort putting right. Never leave your car unlocked in the driveway.

Our daytime and evening Safety Patrols continue to help keep crime stats low but we can only do so much with the faithful few that continue to support this effort. We need more volunteers for this effort and I encourage you to get in touch with Russ Spicher the patrol organizer. A couple of hours a month is all we ask of you.

Crime stats are not currently available as APD is in the process of upgrading their systems. Hopefully we will get this information soon and be able to pass it on to everyone.

Summer is over and we are starting to get ready for the Holiday Season. Be advised that the city's Code Enforcement officers are very active and will cite you for weeds if they are more than 4 inches in any direction. They will also take action in Metro Court for repeat offenders from weeds to inoperable vehicles. If you see a problem report it to 311 and get a reference number to follow up if nothing happens within a reasonable time frame.

This year's National Night Out was held on Tuesday, August 5 and was a great success thanks to the excellent planning by Michael, Christy, Robert and Hugh of our Directors. Please see a full report later in this Newsletter.



National Night Out 2014 Report

On Tuesday, August 5, more than one hundred households from our neighborhood participated with others across the country in National Night Out Against Crime, or NNO. Gatherings were held at 12 different homes, usually in the driveway or front porch. First and foremost, we want to thank our hosts for spending time handing out invites and preparing to have neighbors over to their homes. Activities like this wouldn't be possible without the support of friendly and helpful volunteers like you!

The Neighborhood Association provided hosts with a yard sign, invitations to distribute to neighbors, sign-in materials, and a stipend for drinks and snacks. Hosts were asked to set up chairs, a table for sign in, refreshments, and to serve as a gathering point to engage conversation on their street and in some cases, surrounding streets, and then return the sign and sign-in sheet. This partnership between HHNA and volunteer hosts is at the heart of NNO, and we value each and every one who gave of their time.

The purpose of these gatherings each August is to provide a time and place for all neighbors to become acquainted with each other and get us talking about ways to fight crime. Heritage Hills has seen several incidents of mailbox vandalism and auto burglary in recent months. Having neighbors aware of each other and keeping an eye out for suspicious activities helps get more information passed on to law enforcement agencies. Representatives from various city departments, including police, stopped by at most of the events to pass out information and answer questions.

We had several generous sponsors for our NNO this year. 

Neighbors on my street enjoyed meeting with one another again and making new acquaintances and hope to plan more than one activity during the year where we can all get together. I think this quote from the website for National Association of Town Watch, the organization that began National Night Out, sums it up well: "While the one night is certainly not an answer to crime, drugs and violence, National Night Out represents the kind of spirit, energy and determination to help make neighborhoods a safer place year round."

I was secretary for several years & now have functioned as treasurer for the past few years. I think Heritage Hills is a great place to live and I feel a way to ensure that is by donating my time as a board member.

Carl Davidson - Carl has lived in Heritage Hills for over 20 years. He has served on the Board for several years. He previously served as Treasurer and is currently a member of our Safety Patrol and Zoning committee.

Building Futures & Foundations Mentoring Project is an innovative program in which committed and well-trained volunteers are matched with young people between the ages of 14-21 who have either aged out of foster care or are atrisk of doing so.

Every day in New Mexico there are approximately 200 young people who are likely to "age out" of the foster care system. These young people were taken into foster care and never reunified with family or found an alternative home. At age 18 they leave the system without having had the experiences and opportunities necessary to develop self-advocacy skills, to build positive peer networks and to access the family and community supports all young people need to achieve their dreams and become successful adults.

Many of these young people would love to have an adult in their lives whom they can rely on, as a role model, for guidance and friendship. You can make a difference! By supporting our young people in this long-term mentoring relationship they gain stability, confidence and most importantly the comfort of knowing that someone cares.

Building Futures & Foundations is a strong partner in supporting the development and longevity of these relationships. We provide our mentors and mentees with 24 hour crisis support, on-going training, monthly group events and much more. You won't be in it alone!
