

HHNA leadership does not organize or fund events for NNO, but we encourage each street to find a way to participate by holding a get together in a neighbor's driveway, for example. It's a great way to meet new neighbors and renew acquaintances with old ones. Please call 311 to register your event with the City so you can have representatives from the police department visit!

CRIME & SAFETY REPORT

January – March 2017

You can find crime statistics for the last 6 months for our neighborhood on the internet at www.crimemapping.com. Type in the school's address as a center point – 7500 Barstow NE – and a map will pop up similar to the one on the next page. You can click on each crime marker to see the type of incident along with the date and time. Heritage Hills had approximately 50 criminal incidents reported to the APD in the last 6 months. You can view various charts and reports based on these reports. One clear trend is that crime is up during weekdays (M-F) and down on the weekends in our neighborhood.

Another way to get details about crime in our area is to sign up for Daily Watch Notes from our Area Command. Go to http://www.northeastareacommand.com, scroll to the bottom where the newsletter sign up is and enter your information. You will get email messages that look like this:


Below are the last 24 hours of Property Crimes in the Northeast Area Command:

There were 5 Auto Thefts: 6200 blk of Indian School, 6200 blk of Mossman, 5800 blk of Harper....

There were 7 Auto Burglaries: 6100 blk of Osuna, 3900 blk of Lafayette Points of entry included broken windows, punched door locks, and pried door locks. Items taken include backpacks, gym bags, wallets, and tools.

There were 2 Residential Burglaries: 3000 blk of Sierra and 7800 blk of Vista Del Arroyo. Points of entry included an open garage and pried open doors. Items taken include tools and other miscellaneous items.

These emails often include useful tips to help keep you from becoming a victim of property crime.

Our **safety patrol** drives the neighborhood between 4 and 8 times a month. This is a volunteer group that looks for open garage doors day and night and any suspicious happenings.

As warmer weather approaches and heat builds up in our garages, many of us open our garage doors in the evening to cool down the garage. This becomes a problem when we forget to close the door. An open, unattended garage <u>day or night</u> is an invitation to "the bad guys" to help themselves to our property.

HERITAGE HILLS REALTY CORNER

Thinking about buying or selling in our neighborhood? There has been a lot of activity with home sales within Heritage Hills recently. This info is based off the MLS data as of March 11, 2017. There are currently 10 homes Pending "under contract" and 4 others Active "for sale". In the last 6 months, 15 homes have Closed with an average sales price of \$138/SqFt. The range of sale prices has been \$122-155/SqFt - based on size and condition and other factors. In actual dollar amounts, the range has been \$210K - \$280K with an average selling price of \$248K for an average sized home in our neighborhood of 1,760 SqFt.
