SUMMER 2019 PARK UPDATE

From drugs, noise, trash to crime, our local park, Heritage Hills Park, needed attention and a solution. There were times in our park's past where this park did not seem very safe and looked like a dump. The people who lived along the park had bottles and trash thrown at them if they made a comment to those that were trashing the park. People were sleeping in their cars in the parking lot and it looked like a war zone after they emptied trash from their cars.

Well, Heritage Hills Neighborhood Association stepped up to the plate. They worked with the City of Albuquerque Parks and Recreation Department to try and take back the park as a peaceful, beautiful place to take morning strolls, play soccer and enjoy the great outdoors. A team of individuals that frequented the park came together, and with the permission of parks and recreation, began closing the park gate at night and reopening it in the mornings. This team of individuals who live in Heritage Hills, Cherry Hills and Heritage East neighborhoods close the gates at dusk and reopen them at dawn.

There was an adjustment period, where people who would be hanging out at the park were told the gate was going to be closed during the night and people became angry and reluctant to leave. People were also waiting in the morning to enter the park, but had to wait for the gate to be opened.

Today, the park is a pleasurable experience. The playground, trees, and grass became welcoming again where the kiddos swing on the swings, the soccer players play soccer, the runners run the path and the dogs walkers walk their dogs. The Sandia Mountain now smiles down on Heritage Hills Park and it became OUR neighborhood park again!
